WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NW INDIA
INCLUDING DELHI NCR FOR NEXT SEVEN DAYS

During July 2016 Delhi NCR (Safdarjung) received 292.5 mm (39% above normal) rainfall against monthly total of 210.6 mm. It is the 3rd highest rainfall recorded during last 13 years. 2nd highest rainfall of amount 304.5 mm was recorded in 2013 and highest rainfall of 313.3 mm was recorded in 2006. All time record rainfall over Delhi and NCR is 632.2 mm during July 2003.

Next spell of rainfall activity is likely to commence from 06 August 2016 over North-West India.

Heavy rain is likely at isolated places over Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and East Rajasthan on 06.08.2016 and at isolated places over Uttar Pradesh and west Rajasthan on 07.08.2016. Heavy rain is very likely at isolated places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and west Uttar Pradesh and north Rajasthan on 08.08.2016 and Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Punjab, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and adjoining northeast Rajasthan on 09.08.2016.

Rainfall activity is likely to increase over Delhi NCR from 07 August onwards. Light rainfall or drizzle will occur at many places during 7-10 August 2016 light with Moderate rain (2-6 cm) at few places 8 to 10 August with isolated heavy rainfall (> 7 cm) from 8 August afternoon onwards for next 48 hours.
